Re: School Committee Letter of Interest

Dear Members of the Plymouth School Committee and Select Board,

I want to take this opportunity to express my interest in the vacant position on the Plymouth School Committee. I am 18 years old, a lifelong resident of Plymouth, and a lifelong Plymouth Public Schools student. I expect to graduate in June 2025 from Plymouth South High School.

Throughout my life, I have been exposed to politics and public service. At age 8, I had the opportunity to meet Former Massachusetts Governor Charlie Baker, before subsequently meeting New Hampshire Governor Chris Sununu and First Lady Valerie Sununu at the Bridges House in Concord. Consequently, when coupled with a love of history, I developed a passion for public service and American Politics early in my life—with my ultimate career goal being to run for the Presidency of the United States—on a platform of: *Empower*, *Inspire*, *Excel*.

Accordingly, since my Freshman year at PSHS, I have undertaken various endeavors to serve both PSHS and beyond. During my Sophomore year, I served as a Student Council Class President and successfully fundraised for my class' junior prom, produced a balanced budget, and increased class council involvement. Furthermore, since my Junior year, I have served on the PSHS School Council and Breakfast Club advisory boards. As a School Council member, I have reviewed New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC) objectives, advocated for no-phones-in-class policies, identified attendance impediments, and proposed an implementation approach to AI. Likewise, as a Breakfast Club board member, I have shed light on conundrums from vaping to parking fees and parking lot speeding. Thus, being a current high school student will enable me to bring a unique student perspective to the committee—and in turn shed light on and rectify the issues that affect me and all students in Plymouth.

My most significant experience in public service, however, came from my time as a Legislative Intern with State Representative Mathew Muratore's office—a role I served in from June 2023 to November 2024. As an intern, I performed numerous duties, including analyzing fiscal state budget benefits for the 1st Plymouth District, writing committee letters, researching legislation, confronting constituent dilemmas both in-person and over the phone, and meeting with lobbyists. Thus, on top of the recreational knowledge I possess of the Federal Government, my experience as an intern has equipped me with an extensive understanding of the Commonwealth's Government—which uniquely and perfectly positions me to advocate for Plymouth Public Schools at the state level and possess all the necessary knowledge to ensuring Plymouth Public Schools continues to *make dreams come true*.

Owing to my experience in state government and my time as a high school student, there are multiple pronounced issues that I have already embarked upon addressing and will continue to on the Plymouth School Committee. Foremost, with the Massachusetts Comprehensive Assessment System (MCAS) being null and void as a graduation requirement in November's election—a decision which has the potential to decrease the value of a Massachusetts high school diploma, I am committed to ensuring Plymouth diploma's both *maintain* and *exceed* the value of surrounding municipalities in the Commonwealth.

As part of preserving a Plymouth diploma's value, as a committee member, I would advocate for the addition of completing a Personal Money Management course to graduate high school, along with the inclusion of *Standards-Based Grading* to all middle and high school report cards. No matter your post-secondary path, all Plymouth students will be required to and should be cognizant of how to perform fundamental financial management tasks such as filling out 1040 and W2 forms, budgeting net income, and how to write a check. Furthermore, the inclusion of *Standards-Based Grading* to report cards will verify that Plymouth students are not simply graded on their completion and cognizance of tests and assignments—but also engaged with the material they learn, such as through class discussions.

On top of preserving the value of Plymouth diplomas, I am steadfast in my belief that Plymouth must maximize on delivering high-quality education while keeping modest budgets. Since 2021, Plymouth taxpayers have endured 40-year-high inflation, particularly with concern for energy and gas prices. Thus, as a committee member, I will be dedicated to critically examining every dollar in our budget and determining where we can make cuts and save money as a district, such as through automation, to cut costs for Plymouth families—particularly bus and parking fees.

During my time at PSHS, I *never* felt getting up at 4:30 am to go to school was burdensome—since I *loved* what I learned and the relationships that have and will continue to

nurture my success both <i>today</i> in school and <i>tomorrow</i> in the White House—something I aspire to make possible for <i>all</i> students in Plymouth Public Schools through this vacancy.
