What do the Arts Teach? Why do we Teach the Arts?

- Creativity Not Compliance
- There is more than one answer to each question or problem
- The biggest challenge for an Artist is knowing when the work is complete.
- In the Arts you must use your higher order thinking skills (Bloom's Taxonomy)
 - Knowledge, Comprehension, Application, Analysis, Synthesis, and evaluation
- It's about getting better, not about 'winning'
 - Learning in the Arts is about progression
- Persistence and Perserverance
- Communication, Collaboration, Compromise(working as a team)
