Proposed Peru Immersion Tour

Proposed Dates: 4/18/26 – 4/26/26 (April Vacation)

Grade Levels: Open to all PNHS students, grades 9-12

Proposed size of group: 12-36 students

I. Educational Objectives

- Global Citizenship: Through authentic community connections and hands-on service, students will understand their roles and responsibilities as global citizens.
- Cultural Awareness: Students will identify and appreciate the distinctive contributions of Peruvian culture.
- 21st-Century Skills: The trip will sharpen critical thinking, problem-solving, communication, collaboration, and global competence skills.

II. Responses to Common Core of Learning Questions

- 1. The tour is designed to enhance critical thinking, problem-solving, and collaboration through immersive experiences like cultural site visits, local market interactions, and guided discussions led by expert local guides.
- 2. The trip directly connects to the Massachusetts State Curriculum Frameworks, covering world history, language acquisition, social studies, and environmental science. Students will explore Peruvian history and geography, practice language skills in authentic contexts, and analyze human-environment interactions in places like the Sacred Valley.
- 3. Learning outcomes include analyzing human impact on ecosystems, examining cultural diffusion, and participating in collaborative discussions on historical, environmental, and cultural topics.

The secure process, provided by a leading professional provider, only identifies those individuals who could present a risk to student travelers while on tour.

Affordability

We believe every student should have the opportunity to travel. That's why we're dedicated to providing the lowest prices possible and giving travelers multiple resources for managing payments.

Tour Consultants work closely with teachers to build a tour that's exactly right for your students. Through discussions with your teacher, they take into account learning objectives, cost, timing considerations, and any other factors to craft a tour that's accessible to as many students as possible.

Resources for managing cost and payments

Automatic Payment Plan – Our recommended payment plan offers the ability to break the tour fee into smaller installments. Sample hotels

Cuzco, Peru

The hotels in Cuzco are commonly family-run or smaller residences that have a rustic feel to them. Hotels in Aguas Calientes are very basic, but centrally located in the town. We recommend that students bring books, games, music, or other forms of entertainment for evenings spent at the hotels after dinner. Since hot water in most hotels in Peru is limited, showers should be kept brief. Heating and room temperatures in Peruvian hotels are generally cooler than in the U.S., and extra blankets are usually provided at hotels. Electrical voltage and outlets in Peru are the same as in the U.S., so you will not need an adapter or converter.





Aji de Gallina (chicken in locally flavored sauce with rice), potatoes and corn





What you'll experience on your tour

Day 1: Fly to Peru

- Meet your Tour Director at the airport in Lima.

Day 2: Lima

- See vestiges of the city's rich colonial heritage, including the Government Palace, Archbishop's Palace, City Hall, and the Lima Cathedral as you take an expertly guided tour of Lima, Built on a coastal basis at the foot of the Andes, Lima has served as Peru's capital since 1535.
- Visit the 17th-century San Francisco monastery.
- Visit the Larco Museum. Located in an 18th century mansion built over a 7th century pre-Columbian pyramid, you'll find the finest gold and silver collection from Ancient Paru, along with other outstanding examples of art and archaeological artifacts.
- Get a taste of contemporary Lima during a walking tour of Miraflores.

Day 3: Lima | Sacred Valley

- Fly to Cuzco, the "navel of the Earth" and the former epicenter of a vast empire stretching from Colombia to Chile.
- Adjust to the high altitude and on your expertly guided tour of the Korixancha Temple, scene of Incan religious rites in bygone times.
- On your expertly guided tour of the Sacsayhuaman fortress, witness a feat of masonry that confounds modern scientists: its irregularly shaped stones are pieced together so orecisely that even a piece of paper cannot be wedged between them.
- Journey to the Sacred Valley.

Day 4: Sacred Valley

- See a weaving demonstration.
- Glimpse Ollantaytambo's exquisitely preserved canals and narrow streets on an expert-led tour.
- Visit the Maras salt ponds.

Day 5: Sacred Valley | Machu Picchu

- Travel by train to Machu Picchu.
- Visit Machu Picchu, the fabled "Lost City of the Inca" and one of the New Seven Wonders of the World. A 35-mile-long trail winds through desert, cloud forest, and an orchid-filled jungle before reaching this UNESCO World Heritage Site. Archaeologists have yet to determine why the site, perched atop a mist-shrouded peak, was abandoned. See remnants of temples and terraces that have yet to reveal the true purpose of Machu Picchu—some believe only an elite Incan priesthood knew of its former existence. Your visit will consist of both a guided tour and free time to explore on your own.

Day 6: Machu Picchu | Sacred Valley | Pisac | Cuzco

- Travel by train to Ollantaytambo in the Sacred Valley.
- Visit a ceramics studio.
- Visit an Indian market in Pisac.
- Travel to Cuzco.

Day 7: Cuzco
